## 2017 Yard Waste Drop-Off

The City of Kaukauna will provide yard waste drop-off for \$1/bag or can on the following Thursdays and Saturdays at 340 W. Third Street next to the former recycling area:

#### THURSDAY DROP-OFF DATES

(7:15 AM-3 PM) June 1, 8, 22, 29 July 6, 20, 27 August 3, 10, 24, 31 Sept. 7, 21, 28 October 5

#### SATURDAY DROP OFF DATES

(9 AM-Noon) July 15 August 19 September 16

#### **FREE DROP-OFF DATES**

October 19 (7:15 AM-7 PM)
October 20, 26 (7:15 AM-3 PM)
October 21 (9 AM-Noon)
November 2 (7:15 AM-3 PM)

Residents will be required to purchase a voucher from the Clerk Treasurer's Office at 144 W. Second Street before dropping off yard waste. Cash will not be accepted at the dropoff point. The vouchers will be sold in \$5 increments and are good for the disposal of five bags or cans of yard waste. All yard waste must be in bags or cans. No loose yard waste will be accepted. The yard waste attendant will

validate vouchers.

Grass clippings will be accepted; however, the City of Kaukauna and the DNR encourage residents to leave grass clippings on the lawn. Lawn clippings are a good source of fertilizer and can also make excellent compost. •

#### Homeowners Using Heavy Equipment

Any homeowner that is planning a construction project within the City limits should be advised of the following City policies:

- ➤ Any contractor doing new or replacement work is required to remove and dispose of all construction debris at his/her expense.
- ➤ A homeowner using heavy equipment (backhoe, tractor, skid steer, etc.) is considered a contractor. Therefore, they are responsible for debris removal. The City will <u>not</u> pick up this debris. ◊

#### Learn About Public Works Projects That May Affect You

Each year, the City performs numerous public works projects that affect many residents. These include street paving, sanitary sewer reconstruction, and storm sewer installation. Many of these projects result in special assessments against the properties. ## **Brush Ordinance**BRUSH IS COLLECTED DURING THE SECOND FULL WEEK OF EACH MONTH.

➤ Must be a minimum of 2' and a maximum of 6' in length. Brush 2'-4' in length must be bundled and secured with twine or string.

 $\longrightarrow \longrightarrow \longrightarrow$ 

- ➤ Bundles and/or branches shall not exceed 50# in weight. Bundles shall not be greater than 15" in diameter. Side branches on larger limbs shall be removed.
- ➤ Must be placed at curb or alley line no more than 24 hours prior to the time of collection. Maximum pile height shall not exceed 4'. Butt ends shall face the roadway.
- > Roots shall be removed from brush.
- ➤ Brush shall only be placed for collection by owner or occupant who performed the brush removal, not by any contractor performing such work. Contractor is responsible for removal of any brush created by his/her work.
- ➤ Brush placed for collection in violation of these requirements will not be collected. ◊

#### Reminder To Our Residents Regarding Garbage Collection

In an effort to avoid property damage that is caused during automated garbage pick-ups, PLEASE maintain 4 FEET of clearance between your automated garbage can and any other items (i.e. mailbox, recycling containers, and snow banks). Also, please bag your garbage and tie your garbage bags before putting them into the collection containers to assist in keeping our neighborhoods clean. Please call 766-6337 with any questions. ### Noxious Weed Ordinance

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land in the City of Kaukauna:
Ordinance Sec. 10.03 (6) of the Kaukauna Municipal Code requires that all noxious weeds and other rank growth of vegetation be kept to a height of not to exceed one (1) foot. Exceptions are given to vacant lots in the Industrial Park and to other lots in the City that are located on a face block where less than 50% of the face block is occupied.

The City may cause all weeds and grass to be cut and removed and brush to be removed and the cost thereof charged to the property under Section 66.0627, Wisconsin Statutes. A minimum charge of \$70 will be applied to the property per occurrence. •

#### **Electronics Ban**

Effective September 1, 2010: 2009 Wisconsin Act 50 prohibits disposal of certain electronic devices in Wisconsin landfills, burning in an incineration facility, or placing these devices in a container intended for disposal or incineration. This ban does not require a solid waste treatment or disposal facility to retrieve a consumer video display device (a television or computer monitor with a tube or a screen that is at least 7 inches in its longest diagonal measurement) if doing so is impractical or would jeopardize the health or safety of a worker, or if the device has been damaged to the extent that recycling is no longer practical or feasible. Electronic devices included in the ban are computers, printers, video display devices, peripherals, fax machines, DVD players, VCRs, and other video players (i.e. DVRs). ◊

#### Are You Tired of Green Ponds, Rivers and Lakes In Wisconsin? Here Are Some Tips for Healthy Lawns <u>AND</u> Waters

- When you mow your yard, please do not mow the grass clippings into the street or gutter. Please take a little extra time to clean up your property after you mow.
- Grass clippings in the street are being washed down the storm sewers and will end up in area lakes and rivers where they help produce algae blooms.
- Grass clippings contain phosphorus, the nutrient that turns lakes green with algae. Grass clippings from actively growing lawns have four to five times more phosphorus content than fallen autumn tree leaves.
- One bushel of fresh grass clippings can contain 0.1 lbs of phosphorus enough to produce 30 to 50 pounds of algae growth as it finds its way to a pond, lake, or river.
- When mowing, grass clippings should be directed away from the street, driveways, sidewalks, or other paved areas and waters. Curbside storm sewers can transport grass clippings (along with other street debris and dirt) to nearby lakes, rivers, and wetlands. ◊

#### Did You Know??

Pet waste is not only unpleasant to find on the lawn, in parks, or on sidewalks, it carries bacteria which pollute our streams, rivers, and lakes. On walks, be sure to collect your pet's waste in biodegradable bags and dispose of them in a trash can. At home, clean up the waste in your yard often. Rain water can wash waste and bacteria into our storm sewers and drainage ditches and carry it to the river. ◊
