Something to Celebrate

How do you determine what and when to celebrate? After 18 months in this new library facility, I find there is much cause for celebration. Libraries use various categories to track whether a celebration is in order (or not). Things like circulation, items borrowed, program attendance, computer usage, even website hits contribute to causes for weal or woe.

When you compare the 18 months before we moved with the 18 months since we've been here, we find a lot more reasons to celebrate than wring our hands.

Among the reasons for merriment are:

- ♦ An increase in circulation of 35,023 or 13%
- ♦ An increase in items borrowed of 11,203 or 17%
- ◆ An increase in program attendance of 12,271 or 46%
- ◆ An increase in wireless use 7,250 or 42%
- ◆ An increase in hits on our website of 15,512 or 19%

Attendance at special programs like the recent Fairy Walk also shows the community's investment in and appreciation of the Library and the programs offered here. Some 900 people gathered for that event! Even meeting and study room uses have been increasing.

I know the move has not been without difficulties and that the Carnegie Library continues to be missed, but there is no denying the Library is thriving. Numbers are not our only reason for celebration—it is people! Seeing the number of people who find this a good place to read, study or hold meetings is the cause for celebration.

What gives me cause for celebration is seeing the people who come in with friends and relatives, some of whom have lived here before, and seeing the pride on their faces. What gives me cause for celebration is seeing the response to future plans for the Interactive Learning Garden or the smiles and songs of children as they sing along with Ms. Ashley and Miss Mary.

I personally celebrate the foresight of developers and architects and City officials who value libraries when so many communities seem not to do so. I celebrate the staff who work so hard to serve so many people and who do so much that patrons never see but without whom there could be no library at all. And I celebrate you, who value free access to information and literacy.

There is so much in our society we take for granted, but so much that is worth celebrating. I hope your vision of reasons for rejoicing are rich!
