#### **Springtime in Wisconsin**

One of the best things about living in Wisconsin is witnessing spring. This spring we will witness other exciting signs of life emerging around the Library. For one, the walking trail along the river will begin being built. A permanent monument sign will also be constructed at the entrance of Thilmany and Island Street. But for us, the most exciting thing will be the construction of our Interactive Learning Garden.

Much more than a flower garden or simply a place to sit and read, our Interactive Learning Garden will feature six unique classroom experiences specially designed to stimulate imagination and re-root our young in the natural world.

The Biology Classroom (approx.

⊕The Biology Classroom (approx. 811 sq. ft.) will be a place for

children to plant and grow in their own little parcel of land as well as a butterfly garden filled with the kind of flowers that attract them.

- ⊕ The Literature Classroom (approx. 670 sq. ft.) will feature sculptures based on classic titles and laminated books that can be enjoyed outside.
- **⊗**Our **Art Classroom** (approx. 300 sq. ft.) will host an place for people to write and draw.
- The History Classroom (approx. 790 sq. ft.) will provide a mural featuring the Fox River, a historical marker and kiosk, as well as a canoe for children to learn about the Fox Valley and River.
- The Archeology Garden (approx. 570 sq. ft.) will have a sandy excavation site to stimulate our young explorers and let them discover creatures of the past.

- The Music Classroom (approx. 440 sq. ft.) will contain outdoor sound and music equipment.
- The crowning feature of this space will be an Amphitheater seating from 60 to 70 children for story times, concerts, mini-plays and for school groups and clubs to learn and be entertained.

Our Kaukauna community is especially fortunate in having access to rich and deep natural resources. Our trails, parks, and nature reserves make this an exceptional place to live. The Interactive Learning Garden will be a natural addition to the City's and Library's educational and physical landscape, offering a bridge to the imagination, creativity, and nature.
